

**RESIDENT AND NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS - TUITION**

A resident student is defined as any student living with a legal guardian whose residence is in Hanover, New Hampshire, as defined by RSA 193:12.

Any student whose legal guardian presents evidence to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Schools of plans to move into the Hanover School District within forty (40) school days of the initial enrollment date may be enrolled as a provisional resident. If the legal guardian becomes a district resident within the 40 school days, the student will be considered a resident student from the initial enrollment date. If residence is not established, tuition shall be charged from the first day of enrollment. Furthermore, the legal guardian(s) of the student must request approval of continued tuition status at the school board meeting following the determination that legal residence was not attained in the allotted 40-day period.

Any student whose legal guardian moves permanently from the Hanover School District after April 15 may, upon request of the parent or guardian, complete that school year as a resident student.

Unless specifically exempted by the school board, New Hampshire RSA 193:29A or district action, all other students not fitting into the categories described above, will be considered non-resident students and charged a tuition rate established in accordance with RSA 193:4 (current expense of operation as estimated by the State Board of Education for the preceding school year. This shall include all costs except transportation). A non-resident student will be accepted for enrollment as defined by New Hampshire RSA or if not covered by RSA, acceptance of non-resident students shall be determined by the school board with the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools after conferring with the Ray School Principal. The tuition status of any tuition student not covered by RSA 193:29A must be approved annually by the school board. Incumbent with this approval, legal guardians of tuition students must annually request, in writing, tuition status by April 1 preceding the school year for which tuition status is being requested.

Arrangement for tuition payments must be made with the Superintendent of Schools in advance of educational services being received. Additional charges may be added to the regular tuition for educationally handicapped students requiring additional services in accordance with RSA 193:29A.
